



Brussels/Bruges (Zeebrugge), Belgium

Zeebrugge is your gateway to Brussels. The capital of Belgium, Brussels is really two cities in one. Old Brussels is a city of superb Baroque architecture with ornate guildhalls, cobbled lanes and one of the finest squares in Europe. New Brussels is the modern city, the capital of the European Union, the home of NATO and the seat of the European Atomic Energy Community. It is a city of fascinating contrasts.

1 Bruges & Belfry

Beautiful Bruges is cosmopolitan but full of old world charm. Discover the large marketplace, ancient Guild Halls, a medieval Belfry that stands 270-feet high, and the Basilica of the Holy Blood.

2 Church of Our Lady

This imposing Bruges landmark, which dates back to the 13th century, is the tallest structure in the city, and is famous for housing Michelangelo's white marble sculpture of the "Madonna and Child".

3 Brussels & "Manneken-Pis"

The capital of the European Union is home to the magical Atomium Statue, a unique monument depicting an iron molecule, and the "Manneken-Pis", an unmissable bronze statue of a spirited young boy.

4 Grand Place & Guild Halls

In the heart of Brussels, the vibrant Grand Place was once a medieval market, and is now home to the Guild Halls with their ornate Baroque façades, the Town Hall and St. Hubert's shopping arcade.

5 Ghent & St Bavo's Cathedral

The medieval city of Ghent boasts a 14th century belfry, historic St Michael's Bridge and stunning St Bavo's Cathedral, home of "The Adoration of the Mystic Lamb", a renowned 15th century artwork.

6 Flanders Fields & Ypres

The region of Flanders became a symbol of the human sacrifice of war, after the 1915 publication of John McCrae's poem, "In Flanders Fields", while nearby Ypres, is a charming Flemish town.

7 Taste of Belgium

Belgium is famous for its many beers - there are approximately 125 breweries in the country - and also its delicious chocolate and waffles, which can be sampled as you tour this vibrant region.

8 Canals of Bruges & Ghent

Bruges and Ghent boast networks of picturesque canals, which offer the eager visitor an impeccable vantage point from which to experience this unique medieval region. Cruises are available at both.
