

Barcelona, Spain

The 1992 Summer Olympics revealed to the world what Europeans and seasoned travelers already knew - Barcelona is one of the world's great treasures. Vibrant and earthy, commercial and cultural, this city of four million residents is the capital of Spain's autonomous region of Catalonia. Stroll along the wide, tree-lined promenades of Las Ramblas and marvel at the spires of Gaudi's cathedral La Sagrada Familia. Or visit the former Olympic Ring on the hill of Montjuic - also home to world-class parks, fountains and museums. Barcelona, which nurtured such artistic giants as Picasso, Dali, Miro and Casals, is a traveler's paradise.

Barri Gothic

Featuring the Cathedral of Santa Eulalia and labyrinthine streets, the Gothic Quarter is the center of the old city of Barcelona. Some buildings date back to Medieval times and the remains of a Roman wall are visible.

🛂 La Sagrada Familia

The Sagrada Familia, Barcelona's most idiosyncratic and flamboyant church, is regarded as architect Antoni Gaudi's masterpiece and has been under construction since 1882. It features breath-taking spires and awe-inspiring stained glass windows.

Montjuic / Olympic Stadium

The Stadium hosted the opening ceremonies for the 1992 Olympic Games

Las Ramblas

Barcelona's famed shopping district is alive and colorful with flower stalls and cafés. Stroll the old medieval quarter of Barri Gotic, visit the great monastery at Montserrat or tour one of the city's fine museums

Montserrat Benedictine Monastery Complex

This wonderful Monastery, considered Catalonia's most important religious retreat, is hidden high in the craggy Montserrat mountains. The world's oldest publishing house, established in 1499, is also located here.

Parc Guell

Designed by Antoni Gaudi, Catalonia's master architect, this glorious park features many works of wonder, including a serpentine-shaped bench, stunning views of the city and a mosaic dragon at the park's entrance.

🕡 La Pedrera

Known locally as Casa Mila, Gaudi's most accomplished, finished work features an ornate façade with undulating walls and iron art nouveau balconies

Picasso Museum

The Picasso Museum houses one of the most extensive collections of artworks by the 20th century Spanish artist Pablo Picasso. One of the most popular attractions in Barcelona, it consists of five adjoining Medieval palaces

Montserrat & City Drive BCN-105 | Barcelona, Spain | Group Size: 45

Enjoy Barcelona's major landmarks on a narrated drive before traveling to Catalonia's spiritual center, the thousand-year-old Benedictine monastery complex at Montserrat. The Romanesque basilica is home to the famous statue of Catalonia's patron saint, La Moreneta, the 'Black Madonna'. After lunch, browse the shops in Montserrat Plaza.

Off the Beaten Path
Montserrat

Visit Europe's second-largest soccer stadium, Barcelona's Camp Nou, home to FC Barca, the most successful club in Spanish footballing history. Explore the Stadium Museum where you will view FC Barça's trophies and
